

CAMBRIDGE TOWNSHIP
REGULAR BOARD MEETING
SEPTEMBER 9, 2020

The meeting was called to order by the supervisor at 7:00 P.M. with the pledge to the flag.

A period of limited public comment was allowed.

Roll call showed the following members present: Gentner, Richardson, Johncox, Kissel, Garrison.

Motion by Kissel, supported by Johncox to approve the minutes of the August meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Richardson, supported by Kissel to approve the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Richardson, supported by Kissel to approve the P.O. requests from the fire department as follows: \$564 for 150 ft. of 1 3/4 " hose, \$29,102 for the mounting of the rescue body for Rescue 11 to the new chassis, \$5,000 for the final phase of the refurbishment of the rescue body on Rescue 11 and \$300 for T-shirts in support of the Yellow Rose campaign. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Johncox, supported by Kissel to approve the P.O. requests from the office as follows: \$315 for six copies of the new MTA Duties & Responsibilities book for all the board members and the office, \$819 for four new ballot storage bags. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Kissel, supported by Johncox to approve the payment of bills as follows: \$18,225.99 in bills paid since the last meeting and \$53,441.68 in current month bills. Motion carried unanimously.

The monthly police report was given by Chief Paterson. Motion by Kissel, supported by Johncox to approve. Motion carried unanimously.

The monthly fire report was given by Chief Damon. Motion by Johncox, supported by Richardson to approve. Motion carried unanimously.

The monthly zoning report was reviewed by Kissel. Motion by Kissel, supported by Garrison to approve. Motion carried unanimously.

County commissioner Lapham gave a report on county business.

Motion by Garrison, supported by Kissel to adopt resolution to renew the Oak Hills Drive Maintenance special assessment district. Roll call vote: ayes-Garrison, Kissel, Gentner, Richardson, Johncox; nays-none. Resolution declared adopted.

Motion by Kissel, supported by Johncox to adopt resolution to confirm the special assessment roll for the Oak Hills Drive Maintenance district. Roll call vote: ayes-Kissel, Gentner, Richardson, Johncox, Garrison; nays-none. Resolution declared adopted.

Motion by Garrison, supported by Kissel to adopt resolution to renew the Marr Lake Drive Maintenance special assessment district. Roll call vote: ayes-Garrison, Kissel, Gentner, Richardson, Johncox; nays-none. Resolution declared adopted.

Motion by Kissel, supported by Garrison to adopt resolution to confirm the special assessment roll for the Marr Lake Drive Maintenance district. Roll call vote: ayes-Kissel, Garrison, Johncox, Richardson, Gentner; nays-none. Resolution declared adopted.

Motion by Garrison, supported by Kissel to adopt resolution to rescind the 2015 building and use restriction for Roberts/Percha for property attached to Lot 5 of White Lake Heights, contingent on the successful sale of a portion of that attached property. Roll call vote: ayes-Garrison, Kissel, Gentner, Richardson, Johncox; nays-none. Resolution declared adopted.

Motion by Kissel, supported by Richardson to approve the proposed police services contract between Cambridge Township and Woodstock Township for 10 hours per week of coverage, for a period starting October 1, 2020 and ending on March 31, 2021. Roll call vote: ayes-Kissel, Gentner, Richardson, Garrison; nays-Johncox. Contract approved.

Motion by Johncox, supported by Kissel to approve the re-determination of the special assessment amounts for street lighting for the 2020 winter tax bills. Motion carried unanimously.
