The Bronson Fire Department (BFD) plans to begin the operation of a safety-net ambulance, a joint venture between Life Care Ambulance (LCA) and BFD, by the end of 2022. The ambulance will be provided and maintained by LCA and staffed with medically licensed BFD personnel. There are twelve medically licensed responders serving with BFD, four of which are Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT's), the balance of which are Medical First Responders. BFD responds to all priority one (potentially life-threatening) 911 medical calls within the City of Bronson.

The safety-net ambulance can be used to transport patients to the nearest hospital emergency department only when the patient needs immediate medical intervention and when LCA has an extended response time.

Emergency medical service (EMS) organizations nationwide are experiencing a shortage of personnel which, at times, increases ambulance response times. LCA has taken multiple recruitment and retention steps to combat this trend including increases in pay and providing free training to students who commit to employment. Branch County has committed to investing \$150,000 in American Rescue Plan funds to pay for Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) classes at the Kellogg Community College Grahl Center offered free of charge to those who agree to work for Lifecare in Branch County upon graduation.

# The City Office of Bronson is a drop off location for Toys for Tots this year. Help a child in need by donating a toy! Pick up date is December 19<sup>th</sup>.

We would like to remind citizens that outdoor storage of certain items is prohibited by City Ordinance. Below is a small example and the most common violations. Many items can be picked up by your garbage service if you have Republic Services.

#### **Bulk Pickup Reminder:**

We would like to remind citizens that Republic Waste Service offers a bulk pickup option for old appliances, furniture, etc. This pickup must be scheduled through the City Office. There is a nominal fee for each item picked up.

Under Chapter 93 any" junk" is prohibited to be stored outside on your property.

What is "JUNK". "Any unused or abandoned motor vehicles, trailers, ice boxes, refrigerators, household goods, machinery, building or construction materials where no building permit has been applied for or obtained, or other equipment or material kept, stored or otherwise placed so as to present a potential hazard to persons or property or create a littered appearance."

If you can, please help a neighbor clean up their property as it will also help yours look nicer as well.
