All persons performing duties as a SEPTAGE HAULER in the Conneaut City Health District shall be registered as per the requirements in rule 3701-29-03 of the Ohio Administrative Code.

This applicant hereby agrees to adhere to all regulations of the Board of Health and the State of Ohio relating to HSTS and understands that any violations of these regulations is sufficient cause for revocation of the registration.

Registration must be complete prior to conducting any work on a sewage treatment system. Submitting a registration application does not guarantee registration or immediate registration. All registration applications must be complete and shall include:

1. Registration application fee of \$100.00
2. Proof of passing the Testing requirements
3. Proof of compliance with any specific training, qualification, or certification required as a condition of a system's approval by the Director.
4. Proof of General Liability Insurance of not less than \$500,000.
5. Proof of completion of six (6) continuing education hours during the previous calendar year (beginning January 1, 2022).
6. Proof of State Surety Bond. (Original bond to Ohio Department of Health (ODH) and a copy to Conneaut City Health Department)
