

Gem County Noxious Weed Priorities 2022

1. Prevent -- No known populations are present
 2. Eradicate -- Small populations, eradication very possible, few infestations
 3. Control -- Work toward eradication which may not be possible due to multiple infestations
 4. Contain -- Large, widespread populations, work to reduce and keep from spreading
- EDRR -- State Designation: Early detection and rapid response

STATE PRIORITIES:

EDRR: Must be reported to the ISDA within 10 days of identification. Eradication process must begin in the same season of discovery.

STATEWIDE CONTROL: Plants may exist in some parts of the State. In some areas eradication is possible. A plan must be written that will reduce infestations within 5 years.

STATEWIDE CONTAINMENT: Plants exist in the State. New and small infestations can be eliminated, while established populations may be managed as determined by the weed control authority, which is the County Weed Program.

STATEWIDE PROHIBITED GENERA: All plants and plant parts in the generas of: Cytisus, Genista, Spartium, and Chamaecytisus including all subtaxa of these plant genera are prohibited in Idaho. These plants are all known as brooms.
