

# **RESOLUTION 105-19 April 9, 2019**

Moved by Seconded by LOVANO,

A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE NORTH HILLS WATER DISTRICT TO JOIN WITH NORTHFIELD CENTER TOWNSHIP AND SAGAMORE HILLS TOWNSHIP TO CONSTRUCT A NEW FIRE WATER MAIN ON NATALIE AVENUE TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY WATER IN THE EVENT OF A FIRE EMERGENCY IN COORDINATION WITH THE JOINT SPRINGWOOD/NATALIE ROADWAY RECLAMATION PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Local Transportation Improvement Program provides financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure within Ohio, and

WHEREAS, District 8 has approved the joint project for funding the Springwood and Natalie roadway reclamation project that has been awarded and accepted by Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township;

WHEREAS, Northfield Center Township as the lead agency and Sagamore Hills Township as partner agency are collectively contributing in excess of \$400,000 of the local share and have received a 100% matching grant to make road improvements including a total reclamation of existing roadways of Springwood and Natalie, two streets that jurisdictionally cross through both communities, whereby Northfield Center Township will pay for certain roadway improvements to Springwood and Natalie Avenue, located in Northfield Center Township, and

WHEREAS, the roadways of Springwood and Natalie are part of a neighborhood built in the late 1960's known as the Spring Street neighborhood where the communities of Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township jurisdictionally share streets that cross between both communities;

**WHEREAS**, the entire Spring Street neighborhood lacks any fire hydrants and a public water system that could even supply water to fire hydrants because the neighborhood's public water service is a private well field that is unable to supply the volume of water necessary in a fire emergency;

**WHEREAS**, in the late 1960's Northfield Center Township and Sagamore Hills Township formed the North Hills Water District as a governmental agency with board members appointed by each Township to begin to find and fund a source of public water to serve both Townships with public water;

WHEREAS, in the late 1960's the North Hills Water District tried to pass tax issues to fund the construction of a water system to supply water to both Townships but the efforts were initially defeated;

**WHEREAS**, in the 1960's the Spring Street neighborhood's residents did not support the then efforts to increase taxes to fund the North Hills Water District by overwhelmingly defeating the tax issues because they had a sufficient private water well system and did not see the need to pay for another water system;

WHEREAS, nearly fifty years ago after the defeats to pass a tax, by court order the Springwood neighborhood was then excluded from the jurisdictional limits of the North Hills Water District and subsequent tax levies were passed by the remaining residents of Northfield Center and Sagamore Hills Township and construction begin on the North Hills Water District system;

**WHEREAS**, the North Hills Water District that now owns and maintains a vast piping system of nearly one hundred (100) miles of public water lines and public fire hydrants that supply water from the City of Cleveland to all areas of Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township except for the Springwood area;

WHEREAS, the North Hills Water District water system and fire hydrants now completely surround the Spring Street neighborhood and have become the primary source of water in the Springwood neighborhood in a fire emergency;

WHEREAS, The Macedonia Fire Department now serves all of Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township and its predecessor fire service, the Northfield Center-Sagamore Hills Fire District have all trained for more than fifty years that in the event of a fire within the Spring Street neighborhood they can roll out five inch fire hose for up to nearly 2800' feet in length from the public hydrants owned and maintained by the North Hills Water District along Olde Eight Road, Boyden Road, Valley View Road and Lucy Lane to service the Springwood neighborhood;

WHEREAS, Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township lack a dedicated tanker truck and also rely upon mutual aid from neighboring fire departments with tanker trucks in a fire emergency within the Spring Street neighborhood;

WHEREAS, the reliance of the laying out of hoses up to 2,800 feet and/or the reliance upon tanker trucks from neighboring departments is not the best way to service the Spring Street neighborhood in the event of a fire emergency;

WHEREAS, Northfield Center Township and Sagamore Hills Township both understand the importance of providing additional fire hydrants within the Spring Street neighborhood to better serve the area in a fire emergency and seek to expand the scope of the Springwood and Natalie roadway rehabilitation project to additionally include a new eight inch fire water main with fire hydrants to better serve the Spring Street neighborhood with water in the event of a fire;

WHEREAS, a new eight inch fire watermain from Lucy Lane along Natalie Avenue between Spring Creek to Sandy Hill will: (1) significantly shorten the distance by up to 1000' that water must be pumped through rolled out five inch fire hose in the Springwood neighborhood thereby enhancing fire protection and safety for both Townships, and (2) the North Hills Water District system has agreed to participate in this project and will seek to expand its jurisdiction to include and then maintain the new fire line within its system;

WHEREAS, the additional fire water main is expected to cost \$330,000.00 the cost of which shall be shared between Sagamore Hills Township, Northfield Center Township and the North Hills Water District based upon their existing jurisdictional limits and frontage along Natalie Avenue as follows whereby North Hills Water District portion is expected to cost \$89,970.;

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2019 by resolution the Board of Trustees of the North Hills Water District agreed to pay for its costs and one-third of the engineering costs for the portion of the new fire watermain within its existing jurisdiction and has further agreed that upon the amendment of its jurisdictional limits it will own and maintain the new watermain upon its completion;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of North Hills Water District desires to authorize its Chair to enter into a Letter of Understanding between with Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township whereby each party will fund their portion of the new water main within their existing jurisdiction limits along Natalie Avenue and to appoint the North Hills Water District as the lead agency to prepare all necessary engineering plans, agreements, bidding documents and the awarding of the bid and accept ownership and maintenance for the new water main upon its completion;

WHEREAS, North Hills Water District will coordinate the fire watermain project with the Summit County Engineer who is handling the Springwood/Natalie Road Reclamation Project so that the additional fire watermain project can been coordinated with the bidding and awarding of contract for the Spring Wood/Natalie that is expected to proceed after July 1, 2019;

WHEREAS, the fire waterline infrastructure improvement herein above described is considered to be a priority for Northfield Center Township and Sagamore Hills Township for the health, safety and welfare of residents to provide better fire service and to enhance the infrastructure of the North Hills Water District;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the North Hills Water District Board of Trustees:

Section 1: Authorize its Chair to enter into a Letter of Understanding, other agreements and court filings with Northfield Center Township and Sagamore Hills Township as may be necessary and appropriate to implement the necessary construction of a new fire watermain on Natalie Avenue.

Section 2: Appoint the North Hills Water District as the lead agency to prepare all necessary engineering agreements, bidding documents and the awarding of the bid and to join

with the North Hills Water District in seeking to amend its existing jurisdictional limits to accept ownership and maintenance for the new fire watermain upon its completion with an expected cost to Sagamore Hills Township of \$89,970.00 from its existing funds.

Section 3: Encumber its funds to cover the expected portion of the costs of the project in the sum of \$89,970.00.

# A RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT A STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY OF NATALIE BLVD. WITHIN THE NORTH HILLS WATER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Northfield Center Township and Sagamore Hills Township by separate Resolutions have requested the North Hills water District include additional territory within its jurisdictional limits, that have been prepared for inclusion and are attached as Perpetual Water Service Easement No. 1, No. 2, and No. 3. 





# INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT between COUNTY OF SUMMIT, OHIO And THE NORTH HILLS WATER DISTRICT concerning TWINSBURG ROAD CULVERT REPLACEMENT

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT is made as of the date of final execution by the parties between the County of Summit, Ohio (the "County"), an Ohio county with its principal place of business located at 175 S. Main Street, Akron, Ohio 44308, acting for the Summit County Engineer, by its Executive, and the North Hills Water District, a municipal water utility, hereafter referred to the "District", with its principal place of business located at 253 W. Aurora Rd., Northfield, Ohio 44067

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County is removing and replacing Twinsburg Rd. Culvert #112-13461 located on Twinsburg Rd., approximately 200' west of Walters Rd. in Northfield Center Township and within the District's utility service area; and

WHEREAS, the District has requested the County to include in the planned construction project, the relocation and lowering of a water line under the culvert; and

WHEREAS, the County culvert design puts the District's water line below the proposed concrete headwall; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to relocate the water line; and

WHEREAS, the contractor will be hired by the County to perform the work; and

WHEREAS, by the North Hills Water District Resolution No.109-19, adopted May 30, 2019 the District's Board of Directors Chairman is authorized to enter into an agreement with the County for the herein described portion of this Project; and

WHEREAS, this Intergovernmental Agreement was authorized by County Council by the adoption of County Council Resolution No. 2019-\_\_\_\_\_; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the parties to execute this Intergovernmental Agreement to set forth the rights and duties of the parties concerning the construction contract and the payment of the contractor performing the work for the County and District.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and promises set forth below, the parties agree as follows:

1. Scope of Work and Responsibilities.

# Scope of Work and Responsibilities.

a. Scope Of Work - Remove and Replace Culvert and Relocate Water Line.

The Scope of Work covered by this Intergovernmental Agreement consists of the removal of and the construction of a new culvert under Twinsburg Rd., relocating the existing water line under the culvert located in the Northfield Center Township within the District's service area, in accordance with plans designed by the Summit County Engineer's Office (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"). Both parties have had the opportunity to review and approve the plans, which are considered to be fully incorporated herein by reference. The parties agree that the County will administer the Project including advertising, awarding, signing a contract with the winning contractor, and supervising the construction and testing phases of the Project, provided that the District shall be responsible for testing and inspections of the water line, as provided below. All work shall be prepared according to ODOT standards, District standards, and the Cleveland Water Department Standards. The District shall directly pay the contractor for those items of work and materials that are utilized to remove and install the water line. All work is to be performed by the low bid contractor as determined by the County.

## b. County Responsibilities

The County shall include the necessary plan sheets, specifications and quantities in the County prepared bid package to obtain a competitively bid cost for the proposed work. The County shall bid, award, manage and inspect the Project, except as noted below. The County shall be responsible for the direct payment of the contractor for culvert removal and culvert construction items on a timely basis as defined in Terms of Payment.

Additionally, the County shall provide in the bid package and the construction contract that 1) the District is a third party beneficiary of the contract; 2) the contractor will be required to work directly with the District with respect to testing and inspections of the water line; 3) the District will pay the contractor directly for the work related to the water line; 4) the District will have direct recourse against the contractor should a dispute arise with respect to the water line construction; 5) the District shall be indemnified by the contractor related to contractor's work on the Project; 6) the District will be listed as an additional insured on all contractor insurance policies related to the Project; and 7) the District shall have final approval of the contractor post-bid and preselection for contract award related to the water line construction portions of the Project.

# c. District Responsibilities

The District shall provide all necessary labor and equipment to inspect and test the water line work performed on the Project to ensure proper completion of the Project. The District, in cooperation with the County, shall monitor the progress of the work and shall determine the amount of payment due the contractor for the water line work on a monthly basis. The District shall be responsible for the direct payment of the contractor for water line items on a timely basis as defined in Terms of Payment.

d. Terms Of Payment

The County shall directly pay the contractor for expenses for the actual cost of the culvert removal and culvert replacement based on the unit costs bid and awarded by the County.

The District shall directly pay the contractor for expenses for the actual cost of the water line removal and relocation, based on the unit costs bid and awarded by the County.

The County will be responsible for any change orders that may be necessary to complete the work on the bridge.

The District will be responsible for any change orders that may be necessary to complete the work on the water line.

#### e. Dispute Resolution

In the event a dispute arises regarding this Intergovernmental Agreement, notification of such dispute shall be sent to the Construction Section Manager for the Summit County Engineer and a designated representative of the District, in writing, within 30 days of discovery of such dispute.

In such notification, the disputing party shall present such evidence as may support their position. Within a reasonable time, the representatives for each party shall review the facts and circumstances surrounding the dispute for the purpose of determination. Said dispute shall be resolved within a reasonable period of time. If the dispute cannot be resolved, either party may resort to its legal remedies.

#### f. Inspections

The County shall be responsible for the inspections of all work performed to the culvert and roadway by the contractor. The District shall be responsible for the inspections of all work performed to the water line by the contractor. All inspections shall be performed within 24 hours of the completion of the work requiring inspection.

#### g. Term

This Intergovernmental Agreement becomes effective upon signature by the parties, and will expire upon completion of the acceptance of the culvert replacement Project and upon the payment of the final invoice. This Agreement may be rescinded by either party prior to the awarding of construction contract for the Project, giving five (5) days written notice to the other party.

- 2. <u>Relationship of Parties</u>. The parties agree that at no time shall the relationship between the parties under this Intergovernmental Agreement be construed, held out or considered a joint venture or principal-agent.
- 3. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. The County and District agree that in the hiring of employees for the performance of their duties under this Intergovernmental Agreement,

the County, District or their subcontractors, or any person acting on the behalf of the County, District or their subcontractors, shall not discriminate by reason of race, creed, sex, disability, military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Ohio Revised Code, color, gender identity as defined in Section 101.02(f) in the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit and sexual orientation as defined in Section 101.02(r) in the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit against any citizen of the State of Ohio in the employment of labor or workers who are qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates. The County and District further agree that the County, District, or their subcontractors, or any person on behalf of the County, District, or their subcontractors, in any manner, shall not discriminate against or intimidate any employee hired for the performance of duties under this Intergovernmental Agreement on account of race, creed, sex, disability, military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Ohio Revised Code, color, gender identity as defined in Section 101.02(f) in the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit and sexual orientation as defined in Section 101.02(r) in the Codified Ordinances of the County of Summit. The County and District certify that they do not maintain and they will not permit their employees from performing services at any segregated facilities. The County and District agree to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, orders, rules, and regulations, as amended, regarding discrimination.

- 4. <u>Equal Opportunity Employer</u>. The County and District expressly represent that they are Equal Employment Opportunity employers as defined in and are in compliance with all Equal Employment Opportunity statutes, rules, regulations, and executive orders and amendments.
- 5. <u>Insurance</u>. Each party acknowledges that it is responsible for providing its own insurance and/or requiring its vendor to procure appropriate insurance covering acts and negligence of the vendor.

#### 6. <u>Miscellaneous.</u>

- a. <u>Integration</u>. This Intergovernmental Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties. This Intergovernmental Agreement supersedes all prior and contemporaneous communications, representations, understandings, agreements or contracts, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Intergovernmental Agreement.
- b. <u>Amendment and Waiver</u>. This Intergovernmental Agreement may not be amended, supplemented, or waived except by a writing signed by the parties. The waiver of any particular right or claim does not constitute a waiver of any other right or claim. This Intergovernmental Agreement may be amended to achieve additional goals of the County and District with the written consent of the parties.
- c. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party shall assign its rights or delegate its duties under this Intergovernmental Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Subject to such consent, Intergovernmental Agreement shall be

binding upon and for the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.

- d. <u>Capacity to Execute</u>. Each party hereby certifies that all actions necessary to execute this Intergovernmental Agreement were taken and that the person executing this Intergovernmental Agreement is authorized to do so and has the power to bind their respective party to the terms and conditions contained herein.
- e. <u>Review by Legal Counsel</u>. Each party has had the opportunity to review this Intergovernmental Agreement with the assistance of legal counsel. Accordingly, the County and District agree that the rule of construction that any ambiguity in this Intergovernmental Agreement is to be construed against the drafting party is not applicable.
- f. No Authority to Bind. Neither party has the power or authority to bind the other party to contracts or other obligations, except as provided herein.
- g. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Intergovernmental Agreement is found invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Intergovernmental Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.
- h. <u>Force Majeure</u>. No party shall be considered in default in the performance of any obligation hereunder, except the obligation to make payment, to the extent that the performance of such obligation is prevented or delayed by fire, flood, explosion, strike, war, insurrection, embargo, government requirement, civil or military authority, act of God, or any other event, occurrence or condition which is not caused, in whole or in part, by that party, and which is beyond the reasonable control of that party. The parties shall take all reasonable action to minimize the effects of any such event, occurrence or condition.
- i. Reservation of Rights. A delay or failure in enforcing any right or remedy afforded hereunder or by law shall not prejudice or operate to waive that right or remedy or any other right or remedy, including any remedy for a future breach of this Intergovernmental Agreement, whether of a like or different character.
- j. <u>Notices</u>. Every notice and demand required under the terms of this Intergovernmental Agreement shall be in writing and must be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by other means of delivery requiring a signed receipt, to the other party's address as shown below. All notices are effective upon receipt. A party may change its address by giving written notice to the other party in accordance with this Section.

- k. <u>Compliance</u>. Each party agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, orders, rules, and regulations.
- l. <u>Ethics Compliance</u>. Each party agrees to comply with Ohio Ethics Laws as listed in the Chapters 102 and 2921 of the Ohio Revised Code. By signing this Intergovernmental Agreement, each party certifies that it is unaware of any violations of these provisions and that the undersigned believes their respective entity is in compliance with these provisions.
- m. Governing Law. This Intergovernmental Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio, without giving effect to the principles thereof relating to conflicts of choice of laws.
- n. <u>Forum</u>. Any litigation arising under this Intergovernmental Agreement must be litigated in the Akron Municipal Court or the County of Summit Court of Common Pleas, and each party submits itself to the jurisdiction and venue of those courts.

RE: Natalie Road Fire Line Project

**Dear Trustees:** 

Yesterday Northfield Center Township Service Director/Road Superintendent Road Rick Youel called me about 1:45 p.m. to tell me that Northfield Center Township would not be reconstructing and paving all of Natalie Blvd. as part of its District 8 project with Sagamore Hills Township. He explained to me that the pavement would be terminating at the "curb and gutter" that is about 275 feet north of Lucy Lane. The news certainly took me by surprise because in the last six months that we have discussed the fire line project many times, no one has ever mentioned that all of Natalie was not being reconstructed.

Coincidentally, the Water Board also had a meeting yesterday at 3 p.m. After my call with Rick, I quickly went to Natalie before the meeting to find the area that Rick said the pavement would stop to take some pictures for the Water Board. This area is about 275 feet north of Lucy Lane and then extends all the way to Spring Creek (about 800 feet). During our meeting we then discussed this news and I learned that all the Board members also understood that the all of Natalie roadway was being reconstructed. Several of the Board members had attended all of the meetings in Northfield Center on this topic and none of us understood that the road reconstruction did not include all of Natalie. We reviewed the materials that we shared during our numerous meetings about the fire line but none of us recall any discussion that the reconstruction was just one-half of the roadway length.

The entire Natalie roadway is about 1800 feet and more than 400 feet is in Sagamore Hills Township. The balance of the roadway is in Northfield Center Township, but they are only reconstructing about 600 feet of pavement and not reconstructing the balance of the roadway (about an additional 800 feet). The Water District is planning to install the new fire main in the edge of the pavement of the roadway. Without the pavement included in the entire roadway, there will be an additional cost of paving the 800 feet area south of the termination of the pavement reconstruction project the width of the area that is excavated in the roadway.

The Water Board discussed the new issues raised by this information and have asked the Engineer to review the plans to determine what will be the additional cost of the fire line project. He told us he believes that the original estimate should cover this additional cost. After discussion the Water Board, by motion, unanimously reaffirmed their commitment to the project. The Board asked the District Engineer to review the original estimate and determine if these additional costs can be absorbed in the original cost estimate. The Board by resolution also accepted the roadway easement area within the

Water District per your request. I will provide update from our District Engineer once he fully reviews the changes in the project plans. This morning I contacted Dave White from the Summit County Engineer and he verified the information that Rick shared with me yesterday. I also spoke with Rich Reville this morning who told me that he thought we knew that Northfield Center Township was not repaving all of Natalie. I told him I was surprised by the news and I shared with him much of the information contained in this letter.

The North Hills Water District appreciates all the time and energy that each township spent in working together on this project. It is unfortunate that significant information about the scope of the paving project was not shared with everyone sooner. I appreciate Rick sharing the information as soon as he learned of it. We will work through this issue and try to find a workable solution. Thank you.

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

#### THE CITY OF MACEDONIA AND THE NORTH HILLS WATER DISTRICT

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is made and entered into on this day
of, 2019, by and between the City of Macedonia, a chartered municipal
corporation in the County of Summit, State of Ohio (hereinafter "City"), and the North Hills
Water District, a political subdivision in County of Summit, State of Ohio (hereinafter
"District") for the purposes of sharing responsibility for the service and maintenance of all public
fire hydrants located within the jurisdiction of the North Hills Water District (located within the
territorial boundaries of Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township) for the term
of this Memorandum. The City and the District are collectively referred to as the "Parties."

The City agrees to provide flushing and lubrication service of all public hydrants within the North Hills Water District as set forth below.

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this MOU is to outline the agreement between the City and the District and their associated efforts to share responsibility for the inspection, flushing, certain flow testing, and lubrication of all public hydrants located within the District during the term of this Memorandum.
- 2. <u>Scope</u>. This MOU addresses certain services to be provided by the City to the District. The services include the inspection, flushing, certain flow testing, and lubrication of each of the approximately 1,400 hydrants located within the District. This MOU does not address hydrants located in the City, which shall continue to be maintained consistent with the City's normal obligations.
- 3. <u>Responsibilities</u>. The City shall supervise and complete such inspection, flushing, flow testing, and lubrication service work at its sole discretion in accordance with the guidelines

promulgated by the City of Cleveland Division of Water. The flow testing shall consist of the static flow testing of approximately every 10th hydrant located within the District.

The City shall be permitted to undertake all action necessary to complete such services, including the use of appropriate signage supplied by the City and any other measures to adequately provide notice to residents of the flushing services. The City shall place such signage as far in advance prior to the service work as may be practicable.

The City will provide two (2) workers assigned to the District to perform such service work.

After the service work is completed, the City will provide the District with an electronic and hard copy of Excel spreadsheets showing all hydrants serviced, and the results of the static flow testing. The City shall note on the spreadsheet any and all hydrants that are not operational. If there is deficiency with a hydrant, the City shall provide one digital photo of each such hydrant showing the hydrant's code in the photo.

To assist the City in the supervision and completion of the service work, a vehicle and fuel shall be provided by the District.

The District shall reimburse the City for the cost of tools and equipment utilized to provide the flushing services. The District shall also reimburse the City for the cost, calculated on an hourly basis, of two (2) workers provided by the City as required to complete the service work in the District.

The City shall handle with due care and due diligence the removal of all paint around the hose connection caps to the hydrants while serving them for flushing and lubrication by cutting the paint bead around the hydrant cap prior to removal.

Once the flushing service work is completed each month, the City will forward an invoice for such services for reimbursement pursuant to the above, which shall be paid within 30 days of receipt. All flushing and lubrication services shall be completed by October 1, 2019.

- 4. <u>Termination</u>. This MOU is effective for a one year period from the date set forth above. Any Party may terminate this MOU with thirty (30) days written notice.
- 5. General. This MOU constitutes the full and complete expression of the agreement between the Parties, and is not intended to modify or supersede any contract or other agreement between the City and the District to this MOU for flushing and lubrication services. By the mutual consent of the Parties, this MOU may be modified whenever such modifications are deemed necessary. Any such modifications to the MOU shall be by written amendment signed by the Parties.

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**WHEREAS**, The North Hills Water District has advertised for bids for the Canyon View Road Water Main Replacement Construction Contract after being awarded an Ohio Public Works Commission loan to construction such water main along with Sagamore Hills Township who will reconstruct the road;

WHEREAS, The North Hills Water District has properly advertised for bidders through Advanced Ohio with an affidavit of such notice that was published on both July 11 and July 18, 2019;

**WHEREAS**, the District received five (5) bids for said project at a price range ranging between \$737,256.95 to \$813,447.14;

    - 3. Contract administration during the construction phase, including pre-construction meetings, construction inspection, construction staking, as-built survey, notification and correspondence with residents.
    - 4. All permitting or utility fees required for the construction of the proposed improvement will be billed to NHWD at cost.

- (b) The ENGINEER shall invoice the DISTRICT monthly for all categories of services rendered under this AGREEMENT and for reimbursable expenses incurred, and the DISTRICT shall make prompt payments in response to the ENGINEER's monthly statements.
- (c) In the event the DISTRICT shall incur expenses on behalf of the ENGINEER hereunder in connection with a claim or matter as to which the ENGINEER shall be adjudged to be liable for negligence or intentional misconduct or violation of civil rights as provided above, the ENGINEER shall reimburse the DISTRICT for such expenses reasonably incurred by it.
- (d) With respect to any claim or matter as to which the DISTRICT shall undertake to indemnify the ENGINEER, no amount shall be paid in settlement thereof unless the Board of Trustees of the DISTRICT has approved such payment.
- (e) The ENGINEER shall at all times maintain in force and effect Architects/Engineers professional liability insurance with a limit of liability of not less than \$2,000,000 (aggregate) and in form generally the same as its current coverage provided by The Everest National Insurance Company Policy No. 48AE003454-041.
- (f) In the event the DISTRICT indemnifies the ENGINEER hereunder in connection with a claim or matter as to which the ENGINEER's insurance carrier has denied coverage under the ENGINEER's insurance policy, the ENGINEER shall, upon request of the DISTRICT, assign to the DISTRICT all of its rights against the insurance carrier arising by reason

of such denial.

- (g) As used in this Section, the term ENGINEER shall include any employees of the ENGINEER in connection with the performance of services hereunder.
- 5. That the District Engineer shall not, without consent of the NHWD Council, accept any employment from any person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of establishing allotments or erecting buildings within the NHWD.
- 6. This agreement shall be in force and effect from January 1, 2020, until December 31, 2020 unless terminated sooner by either party giving thirty (30) days notice in writing, to the other party of its intention to cancel. However, all work in process shall be completed by the ENGINEER and the services therefore paid by the DISTRICT in accordance with the terms hereof.
