Concerned citizens of Penn Twp:

Our township began a forensic audit in May of 2022 to more clearly document how your money was being spent in the past years in our township. To date, our audit is demonstrating where your tax dollars have been spent responsibly, and where clarification is needed. The audit is ongoing and should be completed soon. This update is focused on our fire service and their plans for the future.

Our Board of Supervisors has been meeting rotationally with our fire protection service. Our objective here is two-fold: to better understand the needs of our fire protection service, and also how the Duncannon Fire Company (DFC) is spending the funding received from the township. We have been working to rectify the DFC's past accounting system, as this did not document incoming & outgoing funds as accurately as our taxpayers deserve.

As far as the DFC's future needs: They are proposing to build a larger facility to house both the firefighters and the equipment they rely upon to do their work. They would like this building to be in the town of Duncannon.

At this time, their proposal could cost more taxpayer dollars and donations. The cost for this new facility and updating the facility located along SR274 (New Bloomfield Road) would potentially impact and be charged to Penn Twp and also to surrounding townships which the DFC has served.

And as you know, the DFC relies on volunteers. All across the country, finding volunteers to do this work can be very difficult. The number of volunteers has been decreasing over the years, and things are no different for our township. There is a growing consensus that volunteer firefighters should become paid employees with benefits. Locally, Silver Spring (Cumberland county) is now paying its drivers. Middletown (Bucks County) has a paid fire chief. These employees are paid from tax dollars. To this end, the Board has not yet been presented with an accounting report (number of paid personnel and those costs) or a clear business plan from the DFC.

In summary, there are multiple issues to be pinned down. The DFC does a necessary and often incredibly difficult job. Balancing that with what our taxpayers are willing to provide will take a lot of discussion and compromise. If you would like to weigh in, please email me at: Kpotteigerpenntwp@gmail.com



If you are retired, you may apply to be exonerated of your Occupational Tax. You will need to fill out a form that is at the Township and provide some proof that you are retired.

The following items are not accepted.

NO TIRES BEYOND 4 per house hold

NO GARBAGE (typical household waste material)

NO PROPANE TANKS (gas grill tanks, etc.)

NO TIRES "MOUNTED ON WHEELS"

NO YARD WASTE - (Grass Clippings, Shrubs, Trees, Limbs, Trimmings, Leaves, Sod, Tree Stumps, Gravel, Macadam or Dirt)

NO CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS - cement, shingles, drywall, concrete

NO Wood or similar items greater than four (4) feet long, (must be tied and bundled with 50 lb. Maximum weight)

NO LOOSE INSULATION (must be tied and bundled)

NO Loose Piles of any material (all small items must be bundled, boxed or bagged with 50 lb. max. weight)

NO Heavy Car and/Truck Parts (engines, transmissions, axles, etc.)

NO Commercial and/or Industrial Waste of any type

NO Monitors, Computers or TV's



PERMITS NEEDED IN PENN TOWNSHIP – Do not forget that permits are needed for pools, fences, and any other structure. When in doubt call and sale What pools do not realize is that if a structure is

in doubt, call and ask. What people do not realize is that if a structure is made without permits, the state law allows the removal of the structure at the cost of the landowner. The Township does not wish to do this. It is just easier to find out if you need one. **NOTE:** All permits need an

address for issuing. See the Township Secretary if you do not have one.

Zoning Permit – A zoning permit is required when any new structure is put on a property, or use of the

property is changed. NOTE: All Zoning Permits now require a copy of the deed of the property that improvements are being made on. And an address if there

is not one already.

Sign Permit - A sign permit is needed for all new signs, if one business leaves and another comes

in, or a business name change.

Driveway Permit – A driveway permit is needed when you wish to place a new driveway or repave an

existing driveway.

Paving Permit – A paving permit is needed when you go from a dirt or gravel driveway to a paved or

repaved driveway. This is to be sure that the driveway ties into the road properly and

the swale is maintained for stormwater functions.

Building Permit - A building permit is needed for the construction of new buildings, additions, and some

repairs/alterations within the home. If you are in the floodplain, please put that

information on the application.

If you have any questions, please call the Township Office.

CODES

If you have a complaint or concern, please put it in writing. You can mail, drop off at the office, or email it to the Township at penntwp6@ptd.net.

The Codes Officer would like to remind everyone that when the snow comes snow **cannot** be put into the street. This is a safety issue and will help the highway crew to clean up the streets. Violators will be fined.

Mass Notification

Penn Township has now joined RAVE for notifications of emergencies. Please submit your phone numbers to be put on the list. You can submit your cell phone or home phone. Please call the office at 717-834-5281.

Room Rental

Penn Township rents rooms in the township Building for events. The cost is \$80.00 for the large room and \$40.00 for the small room. Please call the Township to reserve a room at 717-834-5281. Beware that the grounds are rented for different events and parking may be crowded. The rooms come with the kitchen and bathrooms.

PARK AND RECREATION BOARD:


Give-a-way is open to everyone, first come first serve. There will be no holds.





driveway into the street. You can be held liable for accidents that result after snow has been shoveled or plowed onto the roadways. If possible, wait until after the street has been plowed before cleaning your driveway opening. Snow should be plowed or shoveled to the right side of the driveway as you are facing the roadway. By being plowed away from the direction of oncoming

snowplows, this will prevent the bulk of snow being pushed back onto the driveway. There is no way plowing can be accomplished without depositing some snow into the driveway openings. **REMINDER:** Keep fire hydrants, storm drains, and mailboxes open.
