Police Chief, Eric Debus, said we have two reserve officers currently and he would like to pay them an hourly stipend similar to the Fire Department. Pay would be \$12.50/hour with a minimum of 16 hours to be worked each month, and an average of 28 hours a month. Money is in the overtime budget for the police department. Council Member Priest made a motion to approve the stipend pay for Officers, budget managed by Debus. Council Member Shumake seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Discussion and any Necessary Action Concerning Short Term Rentals in the City (City Administrator)

Council would like staff to research further, and bring back to Council in the Spring.

3. Discussion/Action relative to temporary paid time off for severe illness (i.e., COVID, or flu) through December 31, 2023 (City Administrator)

City Administrator DeGan asked Council to consider severe illness pay for staff through December 31, 2023. DeGan stated it would be 5 paid sick days per 6 month period with doctor diagnosis of Covid-19 or the flu. Mayor Pro-Tem McCabe made a motion to approve the temporary relief for employees as requested. Council Member Tye seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.


TRAINING





The body armor currently worn by Rhome police officers provides protection against most handgun rounds but does not stop rifle rounds. The body armor provided by this grant includes two Paraclete Triple Curve Level IV Rifle plates providing stand-alone protection against rounds up to and including .30-06. This armor can be worn in tandem with their current load bearing vests or may be worn over their uniform if wearing concealed body armor, such as when wearing their class 'A' uniform. This grant is a 100% reimbursement and staff is asking for council to pass the resolution and allow the police department to complete submission tasks for the grant.

401.30 UNIFORMS AND PERSONAL EQUIPMENT TBP 7.23,7.24

- A. Officers are required to meet the required dress code anytime they are in uniform.
- B. Personal equipment will be kept clean and in working condition at all times. The complete uniform and equipment issue shall be always worn except in special circumstances such as firearms practice or other types of training.
- C. Body Armor (Bullet-Proof Vests) will be made available to all officers of the Rhome Police Department. All uniformed officers are required to utilize body armor. All Officers are required to wear the armor, when becoming involved in high-risk situations where the potential use of firearms or other weapons is anticipated. This includes routine patrol, responding to calls for service, traffic stops, and all other work conducted outside the confines of the police station.
- D. Officers will be trained on the proper care, fitting, inspection, use, storage, and maintenance of the armor. Body armor will not be left in a patrol vehicle when an officer is not on duty to minimize the heat damage to the armor.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-02
