Mayor Pro-Tem Tye made a motion to approve the consent agenda as presented. Council Member Shumake seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Regular Agenda

- 1. Swearing in Reserve Officer, James George (Police Chief)
 Police Chief, Debus, swore in newly appointed officer, James George.
- Dissolving By Laws for Fire Department (Fire Chief)
 Council is in agreement with dissolving the By Laws and replacing them with Standard Operating Procedures (SOP), for paid and volunteer fire fighters. The council directed staff to bring back with an ordinance to dissolve the By Laws, and both current SOP's and By Laws to compare with the new SOP.
- 3. ESD (Fire Chief)
 - Chief Thompson signed into the Council Meeting live streaming to answer any questions the council may have during the discussion of changing from a city fire department to an ESD. The ESD tax would have to be set at the maximum rate, \$.10 for at least the first several years to create a budget and reserves for the ESD. The current home exemptions for taxes would not apply to the ESD tax, like disabled veteran's exemptions or over 65 exemptions, unless the governing board opted to add those exemptions. In order to obtain an ESD it would have to go through an election. Starting with a petition with 100 signatures within the bounds currently being serviced by the Rhome Fire Department (54 square miles), any new annexations would have to have 50 signatures on the petition to become included in the ESD going forward. The County would bear the cost of the election. The board of the ESD (separate from city oversight) would decide where the new fire department would be located, what the tax rate is set at each year, and the guidelines for operations. Any homeowners located more than 5 miles away from wherever the station would be moved to would be affected by their insurance rates. This item had no action taken, discussion only.
- 4. MDD Update from Boyd Mayor Holmes (City Administrator)

 Mayor Holmes from Boyd came in and talked about the Municipal Development District they created in Boyd and how it benefits the City of Boyd. The funds can be used for restricted items. This was supported by the half percent tax used for property tax reduction being given back to the city to be able to use it for development.
- 5. Budget Discussion (City Administrator)

City Administrator, DeGan, went over the budget she prepared with the bare minimum needed to operate the City of Rhome. She left the rest up to Council. Council Members went through their ideas of what is necessary to add to the budget to better the city. Main concerns were Water, Sewer, Wells, Payroll and Firefighters. Budget discussion will continue throughout the next two months. Council discussed the current pay for Fire Chief, Estes. Mayor Pro-Tem Tye made a motion to increase the Fire Chief pay \$6,500 annually until his first review, at that time he would receive another \$6,500.00 annually. Council Member Shumake seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-17

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RHOME, TEXAS, APPROVING A NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT BETWEEN THE ATMOS CITIES STEERING COMMITTEE ("ACSC") AND ATMOS ENERGY CORP., MID-TEX DIVISION REGARDING THE **COMPANY'S** 2023 RATE MECHANISM FILING; DECLARING EXISTING RATES TO BE UNREASONABLE; ADOPTING TARIFFS THAT REFLECT RATE ADJUSTMENTS CONSISTENT WITH THE NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT; FINDING THE RATES TO BE SET BY THE ATTACHED SETTLEMENT TARIFFS TO BE JUST AND REASONABLE AND IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST; APPROVING AN ATTACHMENT ESTABLISHING A BENCHMARK FOR PENSIONS AND RETIREE MEDICAL BENEFITS: REOUIRING THE COMPANY TO REIMBURSE ACSC'S REASONABLE RATEMAKING EXPENSES; DETERMINING THAT RESOLUTION WAS PASSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE TEXAS OPEN MEETINGS ACT: ADOPTING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND REQUIRING DELIVERY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE COMPANY AND THE ACSC'S LEGAL COUNSEL.

WHEREAS, the City of <u>RHOME</u>, Texas ("City") is a gas utility customer of Atmos Energy Corp., Mid-Tex Division ("Atmos Mid-Tex" or "Company"), and a regulatory authority with an interest in the rates, charges, and services of Atmos Mid-Tex; and

WHEREAS, the City is a member of the Atmos Cities Steering Committee ("ACSC"), a coalition of similarly-situated cities served by Atmos Mid-Tex ("ACSC Cities") that have joined together to facilitate the review of, and response to, natural gas issues affecting rates charged in the Atmos Mid-Tex service area; and

WHEREAS, ACSC and the Company worked collaboratively to develop a Rate Review Mechanism ("RRM") tariff that allows for an expedited rate review process by ACSC Cities as a substitute to the Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program ("GRIP") process instituted by the

Legislature, and that will establish rates for the ACSC Cities based on the system-wide cost of serving the Atmos Mid-Tex Division; and

WHEREAS, the current RRM tariff was adopted by the City in a rate ordinance in 2018; and

WHEREAS, on about March 1, 2023, Atmos Mid-Tex filed its 2023 RRM rate request with ACSC Cities based on a test year ending December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, ACSC coordinated its review of the Atmos Mid-Tex 2023 RRM filing through its Executive Committee, assisted by ACSC's attorneys and consultants, to resolve issues identified in the Company's RRM filing; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee, as well as ACSC's counsel and consultants, recommend that ACSC Cities approve an increase in base rates for Atmos Mid-Tex of \$142 million on a system-wide basis with an Effective Date of October 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, ACSC agrees that Atmos' plant-in-service is reasonable; and

WHEREAS, with the exception of approved plant-in-service, ACSC is not foreclosed from future reasonableness evaluation of costs associated with incidents related to gas leaks; and

WHEREAS, the attached tariffs (Attachment 1) implementing new rates are consistent with the recommendation of the ACSC Executive Committee, are agreed to by the Company, and are just, reasonable, and in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, the settlement agreement sets a new benchmark for pensions and retiree medical benefits (Attachment 2); and

WHEREAS, the RRM Tariff contemplates reimbursement of ACSC's reasonable expenses associated with RRM applications; and

WHEREAS, the RRM Tariff includes Securitization Interest Regulatory Asset amount of \$19.5 million;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RHOME, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the findings set forth in this Resolution are hereby in all things approved.

Section 2. That, without prejudice to future litigation of any issue identified by ACSC, the City Council finds that the settled amount of an increase in revenues of \$142 million on a system-wide basis represents a comprehensive settlement of gas utility rate issues affecting the rates, operations, and services offered by Atmos Mid-Tex within the municipal limits arising from Atmos Mid-Tex's 2023 RRM filing, is in the public interest, and is consistent with the City's authority under Section 103.001 of the Texas Utilities Code.

Section 3. That despite finding Atmos Mid-Tex's plant-in-service to be reasonable, ACSC is not foreclosed in future cases from evaluating the reasonableness of costs associated with incidents involving leaks of natural gas.

Section 4. That the existing rates for natural gas service provided by Atmos Mid-Tex are unreasonable. The new tariffs attached hereto and incorporated herein as Attachment 1, are just and reasonable, and are designed to allow Atmos Mid-Tex to recover annually an additional \$142 on a system-wide basis, over the amount allowed under currently approved rates. Such tariffs are hereby adopted.

Section 5. That the ratemaking treatment for pensions and retiree medical benefits in Atmos Mid-Tex's next RRM filing shall be as set forth on Attachment 2, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 6. That Atmos Mid-Tex shall reimburse the reasonable ratemaking expenses of the ACSC in processing the Company's 2023 RRM filing.

Section 7. That to the extent any resolution or ordinance previously adopted by the Council is inconsistent with this Resolution, it is hereby repealed.

Section 8. That the meeting at which this Resolution was approved was in all things conducted in strict compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

Section 9. That if any one or more sections or clauses of this Resolution is adjudged to be unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Resolution, and the remaining provisions of the Resolution shall be interpreted as if the offending section or clause never existed.

Section 10. That consistent with the City Ordinance that established the RRM process, this Resolution shall become effective from and after its passage with rates authorized by attached tariffs to be effective for bills rendered on or after September 30, 2023.

Section 11. That a copy of this Resolution shall be sent to Atmos Mid-Tex, care of Chris Felan, Vice President of Rates and Regulatory Affairs Mid-Tex Division, Atmos Energy Corporation, 5420 LBJ Freeway, Suite 1862, Dallas, Texas 75240, and to Thomas Brocato, General Counsel to ACSC, at Lloyd Gosselink Rochelle & Townsend, P.C., 816 Congress Avenue, Suite 1900, Austin, Texas 78701.

Please see the responses below to the review comments received April 24th, 2023. Additionally, refer to the revised documents enclosed.

Kimley-Horn Review Comments:

1. The adjacent proposed Lot 66X for Bluestem Phase 2 appears to be labeled incorrectly. This shall be revised to match Bluestem Phase 2 Final Plat.

The lots on the Bluestem Phase 2 final plat were renumbered; the preliminary plat for the Hospital Addition was updated to reflect the new lot numbers. Per the Bluestem Phase 2 Final Plat, the entire lot immediately south of the Hospital Addition is being dedicated as an open space, utility, and drainage easement.

2. There appears to be a 24' public access and utility easement that encroaches on the Bluestem, Phase 2 property. This access and utility easement is not shown in the Bluestem, Phase 3 construction plans. Easement on an adjacent lot not included as part of the Final Plat can not be dedicated on this plat. The easement width shall be adjusted accordingly.

This item was further discussed with the Bluestem development team; A 12' access easement for this drive was added to the Bluestem Phase 2 final plat. This is a future drive which will be platted and constructed with a later phase; it will not be included on the final plat for the Urgent Care.

3. Based on recent conversations with the Developer and City Staff it is our understanding that sanitary sewer service for this development is being considered to be served by the West Wastewater Treatment Plant. If this is the case, provisions for flow from the existing Wells Fargo and Seven Hills Market need to be in place prior to final approval of the Plat.

After further discussion with the Bluestem development team sewer flows from this site will be directed to a lift station being constructed with the Bluestem Phase 2 development.


