## RHOME, TEXAS WATER & WASTEWATER RATE STUDY






# REGIONAL COMPARISON



### Governor Abbott Issues Disaster Declaration In Response To Severe Winter Weather In Texas

February 12, 2021 | Austin, Texas | Proclamation

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, GREG ABBOTT, Governor of the State of Texas, do hereby certify that severe winter weather poses an imminent threat of widespread and severe property damage, injury, and loss of life due to prolonged freezing temperatures, heavy snow, and freezing rain statewide.

THEREFORE, in accordance with the authority vested in me by Section 418.014 of the Texas Government Code, I do hereby declare a state of disaster in all 254 counties based on the existence of such threat.

Pursuant to Section 418.017 of the code, I authorize the use of all available resources of state government and of political subdivisions that are reasonably necessary to cope with this disaster.

Pursuant to Section 418.016 of the code, any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business or any order or rule of a state agency that would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with this disaster shall be suspended upon written approval of the Office of the Governor. However, to the extent that the enforcement of any state statute or administrative rule regarding contracting or procurement would impede any state agency's emergency response that is necessary to protect life or property threatened by this declared disaster, I hereby authorize the suspension of such statutes and rules for the duration of this declared disaster.

In accordance with the statutory requirements, copies of this proclamation shall be filed with the applicable authorities.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto signed my name and have officially caused the Seal of State to be affixed at my office in the City of Austin, Texas, this the 12th day of February, 2021.

WASHINGTON -- Since President Joseph R. Biden, Jr.'s Feb. 19 major disaster declaration in Texas, more than \$600,000 has now been awarded in grants for survivors. The declaration provides assistance for disaster survivors in 77 counties. This assistance can include grants for temporary housing and home repairs, low-cost loans to cover uninsured property losses and other programs to help individuals and business owners recover from the effects of this storm.

If you received damages from the Texas winter storms and have insurance - file a claim. When you apply for FEMA disaster assistance, you will also need to provide your claim information. The Texas Department of Insurance can provide contact information for insurance companies and answer questions about how to file a claim. Call 800-252-3439 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. CST, Monday through Friday. Survivors can also view insurance company contact information online.

Survivors who have underinsured or uninsured losses in the 77 counties approved for assistance may apply online at <a href="https://www.DisasterAssistance.gov">www.DisasterAssistance.gov</a> or by calling 1-800-621-3362 (TTY: 800-462-7585).

#### SnowPowerMegeddon FEB 2021 – Summary

#### **Public Works**

- ✓ Maintained positive water pressure and storage to prevent a boil water notice. Many cities and water systems across the state and within our area were not so lucky.
- ✓ The biggest challenge for our water system were customers over dripping their facets and leaks that customers were not aware of. The Water system experienced summer like demands during a time the City was asking for conservation.
- ✓ PW was proactive in contacting customers that were not aware they had a leak and helped to inform customers on the proper way to conservative water at the same time prevent their pipes from freezing.
- ✓ Contingency planning/coordination
- ✓ TAKEAWAY We were able to identify areas within our infrastructure that will need to be addressed.

Final note. It is encouraging to see everyone rally together to achieve one goal in protecting the most limited natural resource that people take for granted: Water.

#### Fire

- ✓ Coordinating Emergency Management with City Staff (Admin, PW, PD) and County.
- ✓ Winter weather preparations began February 8, 2020, including vehicles, fuel, identifying staff.

- ✓ LOGISTICS: Coordinated stationing Wise Co. EMS personnel for short period at FD to enable better response times to Rhome and surrounding areas
- ✓ Responded to various calls: Total man hours = 959 Total calls = 28
- Developed contingency plans as appropriate (i.e., Bottled Water Distribution if needed)



Pursuant of §418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven (7) days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the **CITY COUNCIL of THE CITY OF RHOME, TEXAS**:

Pursuant of §418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with CITY SECRETARY of THE CITY OF RHOME, TEXAS.

Pursuant of §418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the CITY emergency management plan.

That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
