Council Member McCabe stated:

Last week we had a natural disaster, which we normally don't see here in Texas. Due to the nature of the weather, our city staff and volunteers were put to the test. Many of who had to leave their families in a time of need to provide for the community, and many people they don't even know. I of all people know what it takes to leave your family behind when they need you most when duty calls.

Our Fire Dept slept at the firehouse overnight to ensure full staffing in the case of emergency calls, which they most definitely had. We've all seen the photo of Chief Fitch's frozen helmet. They braved the cold to continue their duties, assisting in county calls, major leaks, structure fires, etc.

Our Police Dept attended many calls due to accidents as well as welfare checks on those without power and water.

Our Public Works who worked around the clock due to frozen pipes, water leaks, and shut down water plants beyond human control.

Our City Staff who worked tirelessly from home to continue to disseminate information to our citizens and partnering city neighbors.

It was truly a team effort and our team pulled together in this time of need. We were able to mitigate some problems and Rhome faired unbelievably well compared to the larger DFW area and Metroplex.

Chief Fitch and Cynthia were even able to partner with Wise County Emergency Services to provide a warming station at the Fire Dept for their ambulance.

I'm proud to work with these individuals and am honored to have them as the go to people of this city for emergency situations as well as every day needs.

Cynthia, Chief Fitch, Chief Love, Sean please accept my heartfelt thanks and gratitude for all you and your departments did and please extend my personal thanks to each of your workers and volunteers. Bravo Zulu to you all!

Council Member Majors said "Thank You" and that it was nice to see Wise County delivering water to the fire station.

City Administrator Northrop expressed her appreciation to the staff for taking a leadership role in this whole event, and our Public Works Director, Sean Densmore, Fire Chief and Police Chief. They definitely went above and beyond the Call of Duty, and partnering in an instance like this, and with an event like this, of this magnitude. Nothing happens by itself; it takes a team coordinating together to make these things happen and I'm so proud of everybody and everybody has great relationships with the county most notably.

"I will point out our Chief Fitch, who well-coordinated with the county and in public, you know, they, got water. I know you all know because I included it in my weekly report, but Chief Fitch came up with a bottled water distribution plan as contingency planning. There's a lot of contingency planning that happens behind the scenes that wasn't necessarily rolled out.

Because we were able to kind of avoid the worst-case scenario, particularly in Rhome, but contingency plans were developed, none the less and so, in that planning, Chief Fitch actually already got some water donated that we do have, and then, of course, FEMA came with a few more pallets of water we received from the county and the county distributed that.

So, I really want to give kudos to Chief Fitch, who developed a water distribution plan. Also, Rhome residents came through and I really want to commend all of our residents because so many came through and conserved water. And that was our goal - reduce our water consumption so we did not run out of water and did not lose pressure which would have necessitated a boil water notice.

We did not have to do a boil water notice as so many messages going back and forth on Facebook of people, wanting to do their part and I cannot thank them enough for, conserving their water, because that is what really tipped the scale was, our own residents. So, kudos to our Rhome residents.

We will be talking more about rolling out that water distribution plan for our ByWell residents that as the mayor noted, are still on a boil water noticed because they get their water through Aqua Texas.

Thank you for that.

STAFF REPORT ON ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION FOR STEERING COMMITTEE OF CITIES SERVED BY ONCOR

Purpose of the Resolution

The City of Rhome is a member of a 162-member city coalition known as the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor (Steering Committee). The resolution approves the assessment of a six cent (\$0.06) per capita fee to fund the activities of the Steering Committee.

Why this Resolution is Necessary

The Steering Committee undertakes activities on behalf of municipalities for which it needs funding support from its members. Municipalities have original jurisdiction over the electric distribution rates and services within the city. The Steering Committee has been in existence since the late 1980s. It took on a formal structure in the early 1990s. Empowered by city resolutions and funded by per capita assessments, the Steering Committee has been the primary public interest advocate before the Public Utility Commission, ERCOT, the courts, and the Legislature on electric utility regulation matters for over three decades.

The Steering Committee is actively involved in rate cases, appeals, rulemakings, and legislative efforts impacting the rates charged by Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC within the City. Steering Committee representation is also strong at ERCOT. It is possible that additional efforts will be necessary on new issues that arise during the year, and it is important that the Steering Committee be able to fund its participation on behalf of its member cities. A per capita assessment has historically been used, and is a fair method for the members to bear the burdens associated with the benefits received from that membership.

Explanation of "Be It Resolved" Paragraphs

- I. The City is currently a member of the Steering Committee; this paragraph authorizes the continuation of the City's membership.
- II. This paragraph authorizes payment of the City's assessment to the Steering Committee in the amount of seven cents (\$0.06) per capita, based on the population figure for the City as shown in the latest TML Directory of City Officials.
- III. This paragraph requires payment of the 2021 assessment be made and a copy of the resolution be sent to the Steering Committee.

CITY OF RHOME, TEXAS RESOLUTION NO. 2020-05

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTINUED PARTICIPATION WITH THE STEERING COMMITTEE OF CITIES SERVED BY ONCOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF SIX CENTS PER CAPITA TO THE STEERING COMMITTEE TO FUND REGULATORY AND LEGAL PROCEEDINGS AND ACTIVITIES RELATED TO ONCOR ELECTRIC DELIVERY COMPANY, LLC.

WHEREAS, the City of Rhome is a regulatory authority under the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA) and has exclusive original jurisdiction over the rates and services of Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC (Oncor) within the municipal boundaries of the city; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee of Cities Served By Oncor (Steering Committee) has historically intervened in Oncor rate proceedings and electric utility related rulemakings to protect the interests of municipalities and electric customers residing within municipal boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee is participating in Public Utility Commission dockets and projects, as well as court proceedings, and legislative activity, affecting transmission and distribution utility rates; and

WHEREAS, the City is a member of the Steering Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee functions under the direction of an Executive Committee which sets an annual budget and directs interventions before state and federal agencies, courts and legislatures, subject to the right of any member to request and cause its party status to be withdrawn from such activities; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee at its December 2020 meeting set a budget for 2021 that compels an assessment of six cents (\$0.06) per capita; and

That the City is authorized to continue its membership with the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor to protect the interests of the City of Rhome and protect the interests of the customers of Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC residing and conducting business within the City limits.

The City is further authorized to pay its assessment to the Steering Committee of six cents (\$0.06) per capita based on the population figures for the City shown in the latest TML Directory of City Officials.


WHEREAS, a state of disaster continues to exist in all counties due to COVID-19;



The area is in Aqua Texas CCN so the city will not be providing water. Atomic Ranch is requesting sewer (17000 gpd) and will pay for the infrastructure required to bring the sewer line to their property and connect via a metered connection. Letter of Intent – Utility AgreementHwy 114/287 RV Resort

To: The City of Rhome

We welcome the opportunity to submit this letter to purse an agreement with the intent for the City of Rhome to provide SEWER services to the property of 44.936 and 1.048 acres of land in attached exhibits. It is the intent of this letter to pursue a developer's agreement between the owners of 46.01 acre tract on Hwy 114 and Hwy 287, which is in the ETJ of Rhome, TX. This property is planned to be a destination resort style RV facility that will bring a high-class venue and resort as an attraction to travelers as well as local DFW patrons to the City of Rhome. It also assists the City of Rhome's expansion of their sewer infrastructure to the SE at the developers cost as well as the sale of its utility services to this location. We present this opportunity to the city of Rhome with the following request.

- 1. The City of Rhome agrees to provide sewer service at the standard out of city rates to the property. (Estimated 17,000gpd)
- Developer agrees to assume cost of infrastructure from the development to connect to the East Wastewater Treatment Plant. The developer is responsible for only the infrastructure necessary to provide service to their property. Any oversizing of lines would be paid for by the city.
- 3. Developer agrees to submit drainage and storm water detention plans to the City engineer for review to ensure that no offsite property owner is affected adversely.
- 4. The City will not require the owner to annex as a condition for service.

The parties acknowledge that time is of the essence and agree to work diligently towards completion of a developer's agreement upon approval of this LOI by City Council.

Emergency Management Plan

National Incident Management System

Emergency Operations Center (EOC)

The EOC is the location where staff from multiple departments or agencies come together to address imminent threats and hazards and to provide coordinated support to incident command, on-scene personnel, and other EOCs. EOCs may be fixed locations, temporary facilities, or virtual structures with remote staff depending on the type of emergency.

The location of the EOC Command Post will typically be in the Fire Administration Conference Room. The Emergency Management Committee will be staged at the Command Post.

Emergency Management Committee

The Emergency Management Committee consists of the following:

- City Administrator
- Fire Chief/Emergency Management Coordinator
- Police Chief
- Public Works Director

Each member has certain roles and responsibilities within their area of expertise.


City Administrator

The City Administrator is responsible for communicating information to Elected Officials including the Mayor and City Council. The City Administrator acts as a go between for all Elected Officials and the Emergency Management Committee and will provide regular communications, as appropriate, during an emergency. The City Administrator also communicates information to the Emergency Management Committee from the Elected Officials.

Fire Chief/Emergency Management Coordinator

The Fire Chief is the designated Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) for the City and is responsible for coordinating with the City Administrator during an emergency as well as coordinating with Wise County Emergency Management for resources or other assistance as needed whether from the county, state, or federal level.

The Fire Chief will maintain a presence at the EOC Command Post and will follow guidelines from the National Incident Management System (NIMS). As the EMC, the Fire Chief will establish the necessary command structure for each type of incident and delegate responsibilities to personnel, as appropriate.



Police Chief

The Police Chief is responsible for the safety and security of the EOC and helps to lead coordinated efforts in the safety of the Community as well as the affected area of the incident. The Police Chief will coordinate with Wise County Sheriff Office and the EMC, as appropriate, for additional resources needed to secure or mitigate the incident.

Public Works Director

The Public Works Director is responsible for the securing the City's water and wastewater services as well as transportation system throughout any incident as well as coordinating the cleanup efforts and additional resources with the EMC.

Internal Communications

Email and phone communications will be the primary medium for disseminating information. However, some types of emergencies will require face to face interactions to ensure continuity throughout the duration of the incident.

For some types of emergencies, Elected Officials will be staged in the Briefing Room which will typically be in the Community Center or the Senior Building. The City Administrator will be the liaison between Elected Officials staged in Briefing Room and the Emergency Management Committee in the Command Post.

External Communications

Before, during, and after an incident, coordinated and timely communication to the public is critical. Effective communication can save lives and property, and can promote credibility and public trust. The City Administrator will be responsible for external communications related to the City of Rhome. The Public Information Officer (PIO) designated by the EMC for any particular incident will be responsible for coordinating communications with the EMC within the Incident Command System (ICS).
