

Proclamation

Of Recognition From the City of Rhome

**National Police Week 2021
May 9 -15, 2021**

To recognize National Police Week 2021 and to honor the service and sacrifice of those law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty while protecting our communities and safeguarding our democracy.

WHEREAS, there are more than 900,000 law enforcement officers serving in communities across the United States, including the dedicated members of the **RHOME POLICE DEPARTMENT**;

WHEREAS, since the first recorded death in 1791, more than 20,000 law enforcement officers in the United States have made the ultimate sacrifice and been killed in the line of duty;

WHEREAS, the names of these dedicated public servants are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C.;

WHEREAS, May 15 is designated as Peace Officers Memorial Day, in honor of all fallen officers and their families and U.S. flags should be flown at half-staff;

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 Pandemic took a physical, mental, and emotional toll, our officers, deputies, and troopers demonstrated courage and dedication in continuing to support our communities, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Rhome honors those who lost their lives in the line of duty, and thank them on behalf of the City for their service.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Rhome formally designates May 9-15, 2021, as Police Week in Rhome, Texas, and publicly salutes the service of law enforcement officers in our community and in communities across the nation.
