The colder months are upon us! When the Village had installed new water meters over the summer, the meters that were installed have the capability of sending "alerts" to the program in the Village office. One of these "alerts" is a <u>low ambient temperature</u> alert. The Village office has received **MANY** of these alerts and has tried reaching out to the property owners via phone or by mail. A low ambient temperature alert is telling you that the water is close to freezing temperatures. If water freezes in your water lines it could break your water lines and/or the meter. If the meter is damaged it will be at the cost of the property owner to replace it which will cost \$300.00 at this time, for the meter only. It is strongly encouraged to be aware of the temperatures outside and be proactive to prevent your pipes from freezing.

PARKING

The Village of Peck has an ordinance that refers to parking on the streets within the Village. As of November 1st of every year the ordinance goes into effect. Parking is **PROHIBITED** on any street within the Village between the hours of 3:00AM to 6:00AM until April 1st. This is to allow for complete snow removal by the Village DPW and Sanilac County Road Commission. Vehicles will be ticketed and/or plowed around or towed at the owners expense. **Please do not park on the streets.**
