The Village of Peck is changing the water bill format. We have had several complaints of residents not receiving their water bills or water bills being returned to us damaged or not. Beginning with the September 2023 water bill the format will be a full page(8x10) sheet mailed in an envelope. The actual bill itself will provide you with more information regarding your water/sewer usage. For example it will reflect a graph of water usage over the past several months. It will also include an announcements section where we can place important messages on your bill. If an account is in shut off status, it will also reflect that in the red section giving you the exact dollar amount and date that amount needs to be paid by to avoid being shut off. 
Homecoming is September 22nd 2023.


Parade will be held at 5:00pm.
